Child Protection Workshops

As part of our Corporate Responsibility program the Company conducted follow up workshops in India to help protect children from sexual exploitation in tourism. The program included workshops in Cochin on 7th June and Goa on 9th June, 2010.

The core objective of these workshops was to enhance awareness amongst the various stakeholders of the tourism industry in Kerala and Goa about the vulnerability of children to sexual exploitation and to also suggest measures which could be taken to control this crime. The first workshops conducted last year in Goa and cochin were a starting point in the action against child sex tourism and were aimed at sensitising hotel partners and other stakeholders. This initiative provided a platform to exchange knowledge and share information for all parties concerned.

This year, the follow-up workshops were organised in Cochin and Goa to strengthen the knowledge about the situation of sexual exploitation of children in India and discuss realistic child protection measures to be implemented at hotels.

The workshops were organised in co-operation with Equations, the Indian affiliate of ECPAT (End Child Prostitution, Child Pornography And Trafficking of Children for Sexual Purposes – an NGO with International links) and with Child Rights Goa (CRG).

The Company signed the 'Code of Conduct for the Protection of Children from Sexual Exploitation in Travel and Tourism' in 2006 and has taken active steps to help prevent this crime.

Child Rights Goa is our NGO partner in Goa. We do several activities in association with them along with financial contribution which is used for setting up resource centres for children who have been affected by this crime or are in close proximity to it. Your contribution towards this good cause is always welcome.

Dear Friends,

Finally I saw this beautiful and charismatic primate whose enigmatic call of "holo-lou, holo-lou" was a part of my growing up years in Jorhat, a small town of North-east India. We used to call him holou (because of the call). As a child there was no alarm clock to wake me up in the morning. It was holou's call and it was time to get ready to go to school. But one day the familiar call stopped. Holou died. The entire town took out a funeral procession and my family also participated. I was tiny, probably 6 and all I could see was a sea of people following a truck which had Holou's body. That was 30 years ago.

When I was about 14, I shifted school. And I heard that call again from my classroom. My friends were telling me that there were lots of Holous only a mile away. They were talking about the now Gibbon Wildlife Sanctuary, home to the only Ape in India, the Hoolock Gibbon, the Holou whose call used to wake me up every morning. The sanctuary is located about 2 hrs from the Kaziranga National Park, known worldwide for its one horned Rhino and can be easily done as a day excursion by your clients. But somehow I didn't have the time to see Holou. Perhaps I was busy growing up. So when I was home this June, I decided to visit the Gibbon Wildlife Sanctuary and finally say hello to Holou. Twenty two years had passed since I heard that familiar call again from the classroom of my new school.

I landed at The Gibbon Wildlife Sanctuary sharp at 07:00 hrs in the morning as advised by Professor Kumud Ghosh of the Gibbon Conservation Centre. As we chatted about this unique primate, the more I could hear them calling furiously. As if they knew I was there...as if they were as eager, just like me to catch a glimpse, for which I had been waiting for such a long time.

Putting on our leech socks, we entered the sanctuary. It is an island of dense evergreen rain forest patch in the midst of sprawling tea gardens all around and I was amazed that it could hold back the ecological niches of seven primate species, including the only Ape in India, the Hoolock Gibbon. Gibbons are found only in the upper branches of the tall trees where they feed on fruits, leaves, flowers and insects. They never come down and mostly remain camouflaged by leaves. But my guide Lalit was fantastic and he knew exactly where to take me. A short walk into the undergrowth and lo and behold!! The most beautiful and gorgeous couple of Hoolock Gibbons were playfully swinging on a tree and singing a duet to which I had woken up everyday as a child. I watched them spell bounded and followed them for at least two and a half hours, occasionally stopping to get rid of the leeches. Wow!! What a morning!!
